Dear Jane,

Thank you for your generous donation to Honor Flight Capital Region. We are an all-volunteer organization and our Honor Flight trips are funded entirely by contributions from caring individuals like you- thank you for your support.

On April 5 we honored 22 WWII veterans from the Washington, DC area. Their trip included a visit to the WWII Memorial where they joined more than 350 fellow WWII veterans from around the country. We had hundreds of folks out to greet our veterans at their Memorial, and the DC Police provided our veterans with an honor escort into their Memorial. It was a powerful experience for all who were involved, particularly for our veterans. Many of our veterans remarked that it was the first time they had ever been thanked for their service, and they were all overwhelmed by the outpouring of appreciation and gratitude they received throughout their Honor Flight trip.

In addition to our trip to the WWII Memorial, we visited the Korean War Veterans Memorial, the Air Force Memorial, the Iwo Jima Memorial and the Tomb of the Unknowns at Arlington National Cemetery. At this latter stop we were met by Major General Jeffrey Buchanan, the head of the Military District of Washington. Major General Buchanan provided our veterans with a personal escort to the Tomb of the Unknowns, and he also led four of our veterans in a very special wreath laying ceremony. One of the veterans who laid the wreath, James Riffe, told me that this was one of the highest honors of his life, and that he was grateful for the chance to formally honor the countless friends he lost during his combat service in the Pacific during WWII.

Our day ended with a 'welcome home' celebration that was 70 years in the making, and we treated our veterans to a dinner and a brief concert by the West Point Glee Club. It was an amazing day all around, and we could not have honored our veterans without your support.

On behalf of the 22 selfless Americans who traveled with Honor Flight Capital Region on April 5, thank you for providing these members of our Greatest Generation with the day of honor and recognition that was due to them for so long.
